Crawley Furniture Donations – Making a Difference

Introduction

As part of the re-densification project in early 2017,150 staff were relocated from our adjacent site to our main Crompton Way building. Prior to the removal of Annexe buildings, approximately 600 items of 'good as new' surplus furniture were removed, catalogued and temporarily stored on site.





To avoid third party cost of collection, or far worse disposal as landfill waste; the facilities team with Natalie Goodchild and Richard Gibson developed a plan to redistribute the furniture to maximise the benefit to our UK operations and in particular to our local community.

Project Plan Overview

- Initially furniture was upgraded in the Crompton Way building.
- After this all UK operations were contacted with four sites taking almost half of the furniture made available. Our offices in North Wales requested enough furniture to fill a 40 foot artic lorry (shown right). This included chairs, desks, tambour units and pedestals.



 For the remaining furniture we then embarked on our plan to distribute within our local community to schools and organisations that could benefit most.

CGG reaches out to make local community donations

- Working in collaboration with Natalie's links into STEMSussex (an organisation committed to encouraging young people to actively engage in Science & Technology in schools) and Crawley Voluntary Services (a hub focal point for many local charities helping our local community), and through our employees, we were initially able to link up with many institutions.
- A mini-brochure was prepared & sent, outlining all of the furniture available (example shown right) and through our collective efforts over several months, we were able to finally connect with 50+ schools and many local charities to distribute our furniture
